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Talk with your academic advisor about fall semester courses and major require-

College Year 1	<ul> <li>Attend HP Program meetings and make sure you are on our hp distribution email list (healthprofessions@lafayette.edu) to get relevant updates and information.</li> <li>Enroll in <u>Gateway program</u> run by the Office of Career Services.</li> <li>Work with your GA on volunteering and shadowing opportunities.</li> <li>Develop relationships with faculty and professional staff members.</li> <li>Begin exploring healthprofessions school programs of interest for school-specific course requirements.</li> <li>Apply to summer enrichment programs such as <u>SHPEP</u>.</li> <li>Complete first year prehealth (medical, dental, optometry and veterinary) school coursework.</li> <li>Read widely on health care related topics or just READ in general; check out <u>the list of books</u> available at our Health Professions Program Library.</li> </ul>
Summer Following College Year 1	<ul> <li>Work or volunteer</li> <li>Keep a journal about your experiences to use later for essays and interviews.</li> </ul>
College Year 2	<ul> <li>Talk with your academic advisor about selecting fall semester courses.</li> <li>Attend our HP Program meetings.</li> <li>Work with your GA counselor on identifying internship &amp; externship opportunities.</li> <li>Pursue meaningful clinical experience and research experience if possible.</li> <li>Identify and pursue leadership opportunities on campus.</li> <li>Continue to develop relationships with faculty, advisors, and professional staff members.</li> <li>Apply for summer research, internship, or enrichment programs.</li> <li>Complete second year of relevant prehealth coursework and other school-specific degree requirements.</li> <li>Continue read widely on health care related topics or just READ in general.</li> </ul>
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Summer Following College Year 2	<ul> <li>Work or volunteer in the health professions field; undertake research, internship, or volunteering opportunities.</li> <li>Participate in summer enrichment programs</li> <li>Keep a journal about your experiences to use later for essays and interviews.</li> <li>Investigate: <ul> <li>The medical/dental/veterinary/optometry school application process</li> <li>MCAT, DAT, GRE and OAT admission tests</li> <li>Fee Assistance Programs</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

- By this time, you should have a well-established relationship with our Health Professions advising team and should be actively participating in pre-health activities.
- Continue working with your academic advisor.
- Attend our HP pre-application & application meetings for the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year students.
- Consider which faculty, advisors and healthcare professionals you will ask for a letter of recommendation for your campus application.
- Continue your participation in meaningful clinical experiences, other medically activities, volunteer work, research and/or leadership roles on campus; if possible, consider taking on a more substantial role.
- Meet with our HP Faculty advisor to:
  - \* Strategize about your application timeline, whether it be for immediately following graduation or after one or more gap years.
  - \* Discuss your schedule for completing remaining pre-medical/predental/pre-vet or pre-optometry school coursework and other schoolspecific degree requirements.
  - \* Identify the best time for you to take MCAT/DAT/GRE/OAT exam.
  - \* Discuss letters of recommendation and our Committee Letter of Evaluation.
- If you're prepared and ready, register for and take the MCAT exam (January–June).
- Set up an individual conference with a <u>Writing Associate</u> to go over a draft or outline of your personal statement
- Set up a mock interview in person with a Gateway advisor or virtual via <u>Interview-Stream</u>.
- Familiarize yourself with relevant health professional school application service.
- Research health professional school curricula, including joint, dual, and combineddegree programs.
- Complete third year pre-health related coursework and other school-specific degree requirements.
- Continue read widely on healthcare related topics or just READ in general.
- If you are considering a gap year, investigate a meaningful paid or volunteer experience to complete during that time.

Summer Following College Year 3	<ul> <li>Continue your involvement with clinical experiences, volunteer work, research and other medically related activities.</li> <li>If applying to begin health professional school following your senior year:         <ul> <li>Complete official med/vet/dental/ or optometry school application.</li> <li>Work on secondary applications.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
College Year 4	<ul> <li>If applying for matriculation immediately following senior year:</li> <li>Meet regularly with our HP advising office to discuss the status of your applications and the admission process for schools to which you've applied.</li> <li>Develop alternative back-up plan <ul> <li>Review postbaccalaureate programs that are the best fit for you</li> </ul> </li> <li>Make interim and final decisions about your health professional school choice.</li> <li>Complete degree requirements and graduate.</li> </ul>
Gap Year/s	<ul> <li>If applying for matriculation after one or more years after graduation:</li> <li>Seek meaningful employment, education and/or clinical experience.</li> <li>Continue working with our HP advising office to receive advice on how to: <ul> <li>Enhance your application portfolio</li> <li>Prepare for your official application submission</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
