Learning about Core Competencies

As a health professions student, you will need to have an understanding of the core competencies essential to your health profession and critical to your graduate school training. In general, health professions schools are looking for your professional, thinking and reasoning competencies. The AAMC (American Association of Medical Colleges) has developed this list of 17 core competencies. But they are relevant to all fields within the health professions:

- Cultural Awareness
- Cultural Humility
- Empathy and Compassion
- Ethical Responsibility to Self and Others
- Interpersonal Skills
- Oral Communication
- Reliability and Dependability
- Resilience and Adaptability
- Service Orientation
- Teamwork and Collaboration
- Science Competencies
 - Human Behavior
 - Living Systems
- Thinking and Reasoning Competencies
 - Critical Thinking
 - o Quantitative Reasoning
 - o Scientific Inquiry
 - Written Communication
