

While some criteria will vary more than others, ALL remain important to those making admissions decisions; you will need to do more than say it, you need to SHOW and provide EVIDENCE of your resilience and durability in the face of challenges.



Complete On-Campus HPAC Application BEFORE your HP school application!

- Develop your HP CV from your resume
- Draft your Personal Information Form (PIF)
- Choose and solicit individual Letters of Recommendation
- Complete your GreenSheet[®] advising/self-assessment form
- Schedule your GS[©] Session with us
- Draft your Reflective Personal Statement Essay
- Interview with HPAC... and THEN... Shift to your Application Portal!!

Application Components

- Complete undergraduate coursework: core science, writing;
 Shown in your transcripts
- Select meaningful and diverse experiences: push your comfort zone; Shown in your HP CV and PIF
- Pursue and understand meaningful research: relate your findings capably; Shown in your PIF, LOR and interview
- Exhibit robust extra-curricular service posture: lived experience speaks volumes; Shown in your PIF and Personal Statement

In addition:

- Plan for expenses: \$7500/applicant/cycle
- Plan your back ups 1, 2 and 3 to enhance your portfolio!

1st Item: Letters of Recommendation

- Choose someone who can comment on your competencies from directly observing you in the intended setting, e.g., clinical, laboratory, classroom, etc. NOT a character reference or 'friend', but someone who witnessed your growth and performance.
- For On-Campus HPAC Application, select 2 Natural Science faculty, 1 non-Science faculty and then 2 Non-faculty (5 total).
- Each recommender should provide a different perspective to comment on different competencies, e.g., a 5 way mirror!

Advice for students so they don't sound silly in emails



Remember: Craft the email with an Outline

- Salutation/introduction
- Why them—support with evidence
- What you seek
- When—your availability
- Supportive documents
- Presumptive close
- Plan for follow-up...

... and actually Follow up!

As a senior biology major who has completed Biol 231: Ecology, I would like to ask if you could provide a strong letter for me for dental school. I ask because I believe you can attest to my work ethic and commitment to learning, as well as to my ability to surmount challenges and implement constructive feedback, given my early struggles in Biol 231. I am attaching drafts of my Health Professions Curriculum Vitae (HP CV), as well as my HP Personal Information Form (PIF) to describe the experiences I've undertaken to pursue my path to dentistry. I believe you can access my unofficial transcript and I will provide a draft of my Personal Statement if that would be helpful.

If you agree, I will provide a signed waiver form and ranking sheet for you to complete along with your recommendation. This could be submitted as early as January 5th 2026, but no later than March 1st, 2026. If you would like to discuss this request, I can be available outside my class schedule, between 2-4pm on Wednesdays as well as anytime Friday mornings. Please let me know what might be convenient. I know you are very busy so if I do not hear from you, I will plan to follow up with a phone call or stop by your office by the end of next week. Thanks in advance for your consideration.

Devil is in those details

Over communicate! Rather than under communicate
...and...

Practice! Practice! Revise! Revise!

How Do They Differ?

Resume: Curriculum Vitae:

Summarize experience Enumerate academic

and qualifications credentials

Highlight relevant Detail relevant

achievements coursework, research

Promote yourself as a Document suitability for

candidate! fellowships, etc

So we combine elements of BOTH in your HP CV!

Mechanics: It bears repeating

- Stick with a plain text
 - Avoid too many bold, italics, >bullets OR tabs!
- Use color sparingly, if at all
- Assess page 'real estate' effectively
- Employ consistent fonts:
 - Avoid serifs, opt for sans serif
- Perfection in format, alignment
 - Avoid Orphans on lines

Approach: Make a list and check it twice...

Coursework: relevance? Honors & awards

Protocols/Equipment Groups/clubs

Language facility Shadowing experiences

Support skills Specialized skills

Positions held Hobbies/activities

... then quantify, specify, assess value & level

Example:

Experience

Dailey Pet & Home Care Services | since DATE

Offering clients peace of mind in pet walking and care while they are away; manage garden, patio and houseplants and attend to household and property chores on an as-needed basis; client base currently at ~ 21

Emerson's Excellent Vehicle Detailing | since DATE

Contract for car cleaning (exterior and interior) and detailing, either on-site or at my own home garage; services range from simple cleaning to high-shine chassis wax, carpet shampooing, interior surface protection, mat power washing as directed by my clients; client base currently at ~ 14

Leadership and Activities

Hostess, Applebee's Restaurant | Ebensburg, PA | Ms Mary McGowan, supervisor, since May 2023 Responsible for evening shift; point of contact for customer intake averaging ~ 84 patrons nightly. Coordinate reservations and table set-up. Assist servers when needed. Train new employees. Trouble shoot customer service concerns. Maintain high visibility presence and cultivate positive customer experiences.

3rd Item: Your PIF—Work and Activities

If your HP CV documents, your PIF interprets impact on competencies Why do they matter?

- Displays evidence of your growth
- Shows transformative nature of your choices
- Provides insight to your judgement about your choices
- Sheds light on your 'why'
- Not repetitive, but elaborates

Researcher in Davis Lab of Neuropharmacology | Full time Summer 2024 | University of Iowa | ~50 hr weekly, 500 hours total | Direct Supervisor: Kat Horvarth, PhD, khorvath@uco.edu Project title: Cell type specific effects of Glucagon-like Peptide-1 receptor agonism in the central amygdala on neural dynamics and cocaine reinstatement

Responsible for: conducting chemogenetic experiments to activate central amygdala to nucleus accumbens GABA projections in a rat model of cocaine self-administration and relapse. Conducted calcium imaging experiments to study the ability of the GLP-1R agonist Exendin 4 to reverse the effects of cocaine on neurons. Performed catheter and stereotaxic surgeries for virus injections, fiber optic placement, and cannula placement. Ran animals through behavioral tasks daily, recorded and analyzed all data, treated sick animals, prepared solutions, and participated in weekly journal club. Presented an oral presentation at the Leadership Alliance National Symposium and a poster at the UCo Summer Undergraduate Internship Program Research Symposium.

Good Ways to be Memorable...

Do YOUR homework first. Sometimes it does hurt to ask!

Address persons with respect; use their titles. Or assume a higher title!

Treat <u>e-mail</u> as formal correspondence—faculty and admissions staff treat it that way! Grammar and spelling matter! Use a signature and start your brand!

Introduce yourself; Provide complete information, specific context (subject header? context? email signature? Useful and relevant attachments?).

Request, rather than demand or instruct.

Provide sufficient advance notice.

Always say 'Thank you!' and mean it!
